"Driving Slowly Down Country Lanes: Landscape, Society & Worship in East Ulster, A Personal Perspective"

This new book concludes a series of publications with themes of Economic and Social History, Demography and Historical Geography in East Ulster. In this volume, the author takes a personal approach to landscape exploration and brings to the fore Early Christian and medieval sites in the sub-region, west and south-west of Lough Neagh, that embraces Counties Antrim, Armagh and Down. The well-illustrated text also brings together the results of some of the historical research undertaken during the past forty years. Some commentaries have previously appeared; most are new. The book comprises 265 pages, embracing twelve chapters and two postscripts.

Chapter One is purely autobiographical. Chapter Two lists and discusses a comprehensive range of valuable source material which greatly helped in the appraisal of community life, past and present. This chapter will be of assistance to undergraduates in this field, as well as to members of Historical Societies. The book is fresh in its approach and in its presentation.
